Welcome to Ensemble Gombert's

Noted for its pure intonation and historical approach to choral sound and style, Ensemble Gombert is Melbourne's outstanding chamber choir. Named after the composer Nicolas Gombert (c.1495-1560), who has been largely ignored during recent centuries, despite an exemplary reputation amongst his contemporaries. the Ensemble specialises in a cappella performance of Franco-Flemish music of the High Renaissance. Ensemble Gombert broadcasts and records regularly, appears at festivals across Australia, and has toured to North America (2009) and twice to Europe (2004 and 2006).

We continue our habit of observing anniversaries in three of this year's programs, but this time we go beyond the anniversaries of composers. Concert 1 indeed commemorates two composers, Gabrieli and Haßler, who died in 1612. They will be heard in full Venetian splendour, with voices, cornett, sackbutts, strings and organ. But in Concert 3 we celebrate Michelangelo's Sistine Chapel ceiling as it chalks up half a millennium; and Concert 4 remembers Prince Henry, whose death in 1612 resulted in the composition of several dozen musical works. Concert 2 observes Passiontide in 17th-century Germany, while Concert 5, our annual Christmas to Candlemas, is this year set in Iberia.

John O'Donnell

 Monash University Organist enjoys an international reputation as keyboard artist, choral conductor and musicologist. As organist and harpsichordist he tours Europe annually. and is the first person ever to perform Bach's complete keyboard works in public. His recordings of the complete

keyboard works of Johann Caspar Kerll (which he edited for the Viennese publisher Doblinger) and organ works of Bach have met with international acclaim, one album of the latter named 'Best Recording of the Year' (2000) in the International Record Review. He is keyboard player for Capella Corelli, and musical director of the choir of the Canterbury Fellowship.

St John's account of the Passion of Christ is recited throughout most of the Western Church on Good Friday. Musical settings abound, from Gregorian chant to Arvo Part's *Passio* of 1982. This program presents two of the finest German Baroque settings before Bach's great Johannes-Passion. Demantius (1631) sets the Gospel as a large six-voice motet in three sections. Apart from introductory and concluding sentences, the text is entirely that presented in St John's Gospel, Schütz (1666) also frames his biblical narrative with introduction and conclusion — the latter a setting of a stanza of the chorale Christus, der uns selig macht, with which we open the program in a double-choir setting by Praetorius — but employs solo recitative for the Evangelist and individual characters, and four-voice choir for the interjections of the crowds.

CONCERT THREE

The Sistine Chapel Ceiling COMMEMORATING 500 YEARS Saturday 19 May at 5.30 pm

Michelangelo, reluctant painter of the Sistine Chapel ceiling, completed the four-year task in 1512. The Chapel was first opened to the public on 1 November (All Saints' Day) the same year. What music was performed on that occasion is not known for certain; but Josquin's Missa Gaudeamus is based on the Introit for All Saints' Day, and the Mass was copied into the Sistine Chapel choirbooks shortly before that time, making it a prime suspect. The motets that make up the remainder of this program were also copied into the choirbooks shortly before or during 1512, so at the very least these works were in the choir's repertoire at this time, allowing our imaginations to synchronise sight and sound.


